

Wow! This was quite a week! I'm referring to what happened with the Stock Market this week. Maybe there are some who did not follow the news from Wall Street too closely, but it was hard to ignore for many people. When the Market opened on Monday, the market dropped over 1,000 points. That was pretty significant. It was significant because for many people, savings and retirement funds are tied up in stocks. It was devastating for people to see their savings and retirement accounts go into a nose dive. Over the last 7 years, we have become so used to stock prices going up almost daily, we just did not expect that such a significant fall was possible. People responded to this tumble in different ways. Even though financial advisors counselled people to be patient and hang in there, many people panicked and started selling off their assets, to avoid more losses. Some people changed the investment strategies. Cliff Christopher, President of Horizons Stewardship saw this as an opportunity to invest more. "But low, sell high."

Now I am not a financial advisor. I have tried to learn about the best ways to invest and save, but I certainly am not an expert. I do think that patience is a good practice. As the week has progressed there are signs that the market has begun to recover from "Scarey Monday" although there is still a long way to go to get back to where we were. I don't know if that is even possible. But for us who are followers of Jesus, there are some things to remember. Cliff Christopher reminds us that "*Money is not a constant. Money can come and it can go. If we build our house on money, it can all be lost.*" Jesus said, "**No one can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money.**" (Mt. 6:24) He goes on to say, "**Do not worry about your life...Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they?**"

So, this is not a time of fear, it is an opportunity for us to trust God. This is not a time to get stingy and hold back from God and others. It is an opportunity for us to exercise our faith in God's promises to provide for us as we are generous with our possessions.

God is good – All the time!

Mission of the Month - September New Hope Shelter, Waynesboro

Our featured mission emphasis for the month of September is the New Hope Shelter in Waynesboro.



The Waynesboro New Hope Shelter Inc. was established in 1998 to provide temporary housing for the homeless from Franklin, Fulton, and Adams counties in PA. New Hope Shelter is a non-profit organization that offers food and lodging to men, women, and children. It operates year-round and serves about 150 people a year, of which one-third are children. Every resident is provided encouragement and the tools necessary to find employment and permanent housing.

New Hope Shelter operates a Thrift Store to raise funds for the support of the ministry. They welcome donations of gently used furniture, appliances and clothing. You can drop off donations or pickup can be arranged. You can support the mission by shopping at the Thrift Store.

Mission of the Month - October Bangladesh Medical Ministries

October is Dr. Gilbert Month for Missions



Our featured mission emphasis for the month of October is Bangladesh Medical Ministries.

The Medical Ministries in Bangladesh were begun by Dr. Fidelia Gilbert. Dr. Gilbert first travelled to Bogra in 1938. She served as a missionary physician until she left the field in 1972. She then moved to Hyden, KY and taught midwifery at Frontier Nursing Services. Following her retirement in 1980, she returned to Cascade, MD and was a very active member of the Germantown Church of God, until her death in January, 2005.

In honor of Dr. Gilbert, whose birthday was October 25, we designate the month of October as Dr. Gilbert Month, to promote giving to the Bangladesh Medical Ministries. Our Missions Committee gives money from our Missions Budget for Bangladesh Medical Ministries. But during the month of October we invite members of our Church family to give additional gifts in support of this medical work, in honor of Dr. Gilbert's memory.

Bogra Christian Hospital and Khanjanpur Health & Eye Clinics treated over 106,000 patients in 2014. A nursing program at Bogra equips nurses to work in medical facilities throughout the country. Health education classes are taught in the districts on such topics as hygiene & sanitation, clean drinking water, child marriage, and HIV-Aids prevention.


